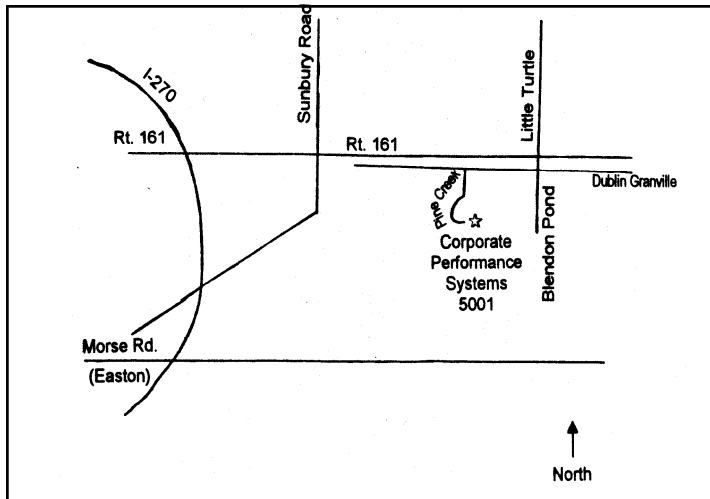

Member Meeting

January 12, 2007

Ann Christy, Secretary

Mary Saint called the meeting to order. Vicki reported that Diamond C is no longer available for horse shows (e.g., Showcase). General discussion ensued brainstorming possible nearby show facilities with warm-up areas.

Randy reported that MODA's checking account currently has a \$1504.79 balance after we paid the last portion of our pledge to USDF plus the deposits for the banquet at Berwick Manor and the schooling show at Delaware County Fairgrounds. Randy reported that there was \$23,125.47 in the Classic account.

Mary reported that MODA's booth has been reserved for Equine Affaire (April 12-15, 2007). We've not heard yet if USDF would like to share booth space with us.

Vicki is going to start work on the prize list for May 19-20 schooling show. Kerrie asked if Pony Clubbers could use the facilities for schooling in conjunction with the MODA show. Four MODA-sanctioned shows are also planned for June, July, August, and September at Amy Rothe-Heitter's barn.

There are five girls in Athens, Ohio with a guidance counselor who would like to become members of MODA. They would like to participate in sanctioned schooling shows and, based on their scores, become eligible for an activity letter through their high school. Vicki talked to Gaye McCabe, Oregon Dressage Society's High School Dressage Program Coordinator, who is working with high school dressage groups. Gaye encouraged us to go ahead and said insurance was not an issue. Oregon has been sponsoring these activities since 2001. Kerrie volunteered to be MODA's high school liaison. Joe moved that MODA assist the high school students from Athens in qualifying for high school activity letters, subject to final approval of any future organizational structure. Did You Know?

United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) is the national governing body for many horse shows in this country. Their job is to promote sportsmanship, make and enforce fair rules and regulations for the good of all competitors, and to see to the well-being of horses.

United States Dressage Federation (USDF) is the national level group for dressage enthusiasts. It was "established for the purpose of promoting and encouraging a high standard of accomplishment in dressage throughout the United States, primarily through educational programs", and is an affiliate organization of US Equestrian Federation, thereby complying with all rules set forth by US Equestrian Federation.

USDF has many smaller local groups; these are called Group Membership Organizations or GMO's. Mid-Ohio Dressage Association is a GMO of USDF.

"Rated" or "Recognized" Dressage Shows refer to shows which are recognized and sanctioned on the national level by US Equestrian Federation and USDF. The Mid-Ohio Classic in July is one of these shows. These shows allow competitors to have points or dressage scores counted towards national awards. These shows are often quite expensive. Membership in USEF and USDF is necessary to show at these "recognized" shows. The only exceptions to this are for people to pay a one-time fee to USEF or USEF to be able to compete at a given show. A member in USEF is sent a Rule Book, which is full of lots of important information. The USEF Rule book is now available online. See the link below. A person planning to compete at a recognized show should be very familiar with the Rule Book.

"Schooling Shows" refer to shows that are managed by local GMO's or simply hosted by a local barn or group of people. These shows are usually geared towards beginner to intermediate level riders, and are usually less expensive, less serious, and often more fun than the bigger "rated" shows. Scores from these shows usually count towards a local Year-End Awards program. Managers for these shows usually hire people who have graduated from USDF's "L" program for judge training to serve as judges. This helps to give the competitor feedback from an educated and qualified person. MODA recognized schooling shows are required to hire an "L" to serve as judge, for at least Training Level and up.

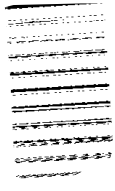
