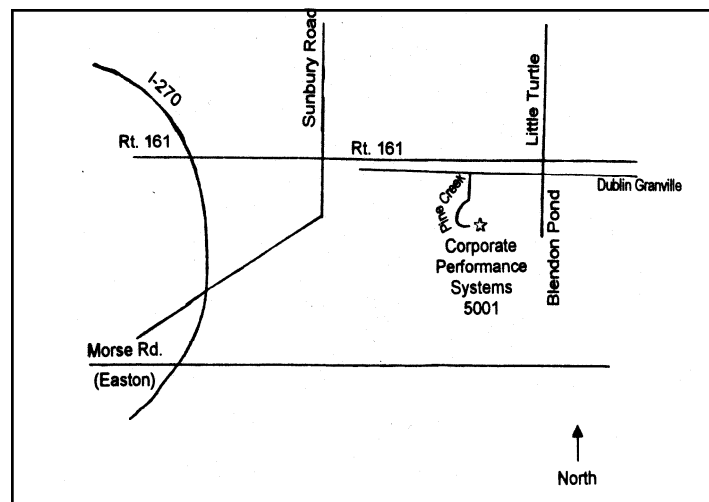

Mary Saint called the meeting to order. Minutes were approved. Randy reported that MODA's checking account currently has a \$1,474.37 balance. Mary reported that Equine Affaire is ready to go next Thursday.

Amy reported that USEF has posted the new dressage tests on their webpage <<https://www.usef.org/content/aua/dressagetest.php>>. They can be printed out on legal size paper and copied, so MODA no longer has to purchase them from USEF for our schooling shows. Vicki reported that the Classic prize lists are printed. We will have breed shows on Thursday. USEF is asking for applications for new programs: Developing rider (3 age divisions) and Developing horses. These allow them to qualify for Gladstone NJ. Vicki will apply for 2008's Classic. She is looking for class sponsors. Mary will inquire at Equine Affaire. Amy will contact Steve about more sand on behalf of ODS and MODA. Kathy asked about ongoing maintenance of the base and drainage system. Mary reported that there will be no Showcase this year.

Mary looked up more info on the high school group, and shared info on IMOs. Vicki contacted MODA's insurance agent who said our options are: (1) Students join MODA but don't hold club functions under MODA's name, (2) Students get their own separate policy, or (3) Students ask their high school athletic department's general policy to cover them. Because of these unresolved insurance issues, Joe Hull moved that MODA not approve the Athens High School Dressage group, and that Kerrie Matesich be contacted to inform the student group that MODA has not approved their status as a MODA high school dressage group. Randy seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Mary said that USDF has approved 2008 MODA to host an USDF Adult Clinic with Jane Savoie. Discussion ensued about what dates we should request. Mary will investigate budget and timing issues with USDF.

Pat shared about a proposed Ohio bill that severely restricts veterinary practice (and other medical professionals). She will provide more info for the newsletter

The next meeting will be May 4. This meeting was adjourned at 8:52 pm.

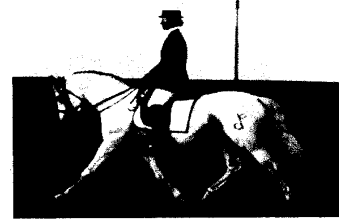

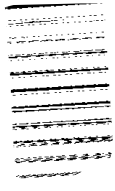
